GRADUATION

TCM had the pleasure of hosting another beautiful and joyful graduation celebration at Stift Heiligenkreuz in Austria on May 12, 2024. Twenty-two students from twelve countries were awarded certificates, Master of Arts, or Master of Divinity degrees. Six of these degrees were awarded in absentia. It is always such a pleasure to see their excitement as years of dedication to studying God's Word, leadership strategy, and approaches to disciple making all come to fruition.

Graduates from Hungary, Russia, Albania, and Moldova shared testimonies about their time at TCM, and how it helped to shape their personal lives and ministries. One student shared that he came to TCM lacking the proper skills and spiritual depth to serve the professionals in his ministry. Through his studies at TCM, he came to see God's bigger picture of redemption and how to communicate that to others. He shared that teaching is more than right words, but that it takes character. He noted the impact of seeing faculty on their knees in prayer for the students. Another student related that his TCM journey included reading 120 theological books, writing 300 pages, drying several thousand plates, and drinking 10 buckets of coffee (Really? ...only 10 buckets of coffee?). He added it was all an incredible experience concluding that it is obvious that God's hand is in this place.



The celebration included an inspiring message from Matthew 28 by Shodankeh Johnson, encouraging students and attendees to “Go and make disciples of all nations.” TCM awarded an Honorary Doctor of Divinity to pastor Shodankeh Johnson in recognition of his distinguished Christian service and leadership in Sierra Leone, West Africa, providing disciple-making training around the world.

The celebration concluded with a traditional meal at Klostersgasthof Heiligenkreuz located on the premises of the one-thousand-year-old monastery. Graduation is certainly a highlight of the year!

Meet Konah. Konah is a middle-aged Liberian pastor faithfully teaching the Word of God to his people in his small town close to the border of Liberia and Guinea. Faced with the reality of widespread poverty, Konah worked with his people to find creative ways to build a church building and sustain their growing ministry. Konah also teaches Farming God's Way and helps provide sustaining food and income for others in his village. Most recently, the Lord has provided a path leading Konah into higher levels of prominence in the Liberian church system that has congregations scattered throughout the country.

Konah is exactly the type of student TCM desires to impact and move from addition to multiplication.

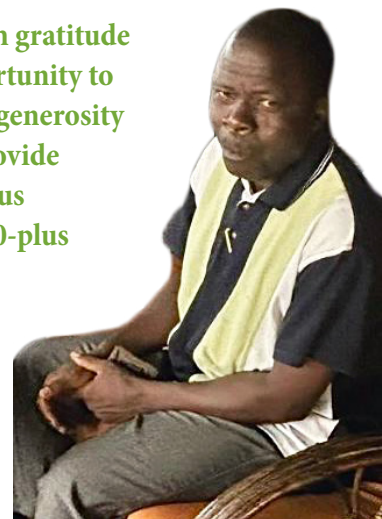

Recently, I traveled to Phoenix to meet with two supporting churches and observe TCM’s class sessions. The first evening, I was winding down from the day’s activities when I received a call. One of our professors from Eastern Europe had arrived at the airport and needed a ride to the location where the classes would be held. He had been at the airport for nearly two hours, so I wanted to get there as soon as possible. I quickly grabbed my things, got into my rental car, and headed out. It was dark and I was not familiar with the Peoria area, so I pulled up Google Maps on my phone for directions to the airport. To my surprise, it directed me north rather than south into Phoenix. Hesitantly, I followed the directions and headed north and as the city lights quickly faded, I found myself driving into what seemed like a remote desert in the middle of the night. Was I going to trust the driving app or turn around? I decided to continue heading north, following the directions on the app. Fortunately, I was on the right track because the route would eventually turn eastward and take me to Interstate 17, then south to the airport. It turned out to be the best route after all.

When I later reflected on my trip to the Phoenix airport, it reminded me how, on occasion, I have wrongly questioned God’s direction for my life. We all have stories where our driving apps have failed us, but God has never failed and never broken a promise. He never will. Our Heavenly Father knows the best route for each of us. The question is whether we will allow Him to guide us. As the Psalmist wrote, “Your Word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.”

Following God’s lead brought me to TCM where I am blessed to participate in the important work of equipping God’s people for service. We may not immediately know what God is up to, but He has a plan, the best plan, for each of us, if only we follow His lead.

Our TCM booth at the ELF EXPO was a hub of activity. From the moment the doors opened, we were engaging with former, current, and potential students. One of our Bulgarian students, Sergey, became our most passionate advocate, eagerly introducing friends and acquaintances to the TCM program. Our Regional Representatives from Czechia, Bulgaria, and Poland offered information to their fellow countrymen in their native languages. Two ladies from Georgia signed up for summer courses at Haus Edelweiss.

The reach extended far beyond our current networks. Individuals from Slovakia expressed a need for further education, seeking to equip themselves for a life devoted to disciple making. Witnessing the resonance of TCM's programs with Christians from such diverse backgrounds was a humbling experience. It reaffirmed the universal yearning for spiritual growth, knowledge, and the tools to serve effectively in God's kingdom, to which TCM is committed.
